JOHN C. VANDERBURG ES SCHOOL WIDE GRADING POLICY GRADES 1-5

This policy aligns with CCSD document titled, CCSD Best Practices.

1. Weights-

- a. Summative=70%
- b. Formative=20%
- c. Other=10%
 - i. First Grade-Spelling & Math Fact Tests
 - ii. Second Grade-Spelling & Math Fact Tests
 - iii. Third Grade-Flocabulary, Geography, Spelling & Math Fact Tests
 - iv. Fourth Grade-Spelling & Math Fact Tests
 - v. Fifth Grade-Math Fact Tests, Spelling Tests, Graphic Organizers & Research Notes
- 2. <u>Late/Missing Work</u> Ten percent (10%) will be deducted each day a graded assignment or project is late. The 10% deduction will continue until the graded assignment/project is handed in to the teacher or until the grade reaches 50% which is the equivalent of five days late. If an assignment is never handed in, then it will be deemed missing and a grade of 0% will be recorded in the grade book.
- 3. Retaking of Assessments Students may retake a Summative assessment with a grade of less than 70% and no more than one (1) time. Retakes must take place within two weeks of grade being posted. Students may not retake Formative assessments (except math facts tests) and/or assignments. Teachers may use their discretion to determine the time of day (before school, during the school day, after school) students are permitted to retake Summative assessments. As a Leader in Me school, we would like to encourage 3rd-5th grade students to take the initiative in approaching their teacher about retakes. Retakes for 1st-2nd will be initiated by the teacher.
- 4. <u>Average of Retake Grades</u> <u>If a student retakes a Summative assessment, the initial grade will be averaged with the retake grade. If the first grade was below 50%, then a minimum F (50%) will be averaged with the retake grade for a final grade.</u>
- 5. Graded Assessments- do not go home to be completed or made up. All are to be done in the classroom.
- **6.** <u>Writing/Projects/Presentations</u>- There will be no redos. In regards to writing, teachers are to use their grade level writing rubric to score, and hold conferences with students from pre-writing through final copy. Students will have an opportunity, at a later date, to write another piece for a particular genre, do another project, and/or participate in another presentation.
- 7. Homework-A student receives one (1) HAM for homework missing whether it is one or more assignments. This means one HAM per day. Students will meet with the principal when he/she has four (4) HAMS in a 30 day period. If improvement is not made, then a parent/teacher/student conference will be scheduled. Homework is not an option. A teacher may require a student to make up missing homework during class recess. (Applecore signatures excluded.)
- **8.** Open Book Assessments— There will be no retakes permitted for open book assessments in science, social studies and health. All open book tests will be scored as a summative assessment.
